

Grant-Readiness

Before an organization can apply for a grant, they should be “grant-ready.”

What does this mean?

Grantmakers typically want to see that an organization is credible and has the support to carry out its mission. If an organization does not meet the basic tenants of grant readiness, applying for grants will not likely result in an award and valuable time and resources will have been wasted. Some of the features funders look for in grant applicants include:

- Strong leadership and infrastructure
- Clear case for support including mission statement
- Collaborative partnerships and community support
- Robust fundraising plan and finances
- Well defined project goals and evaluation strategy

Many grant makers request the submission of certain documents including IRS letter of determination, board roster, logic models, organizational and project budgets, and financial audits.
